# Listen

**Read**  
Proverbs 2:1-5



The next step after praying, which should be our natural response every time we pray, is to LISTEN! Prayer is a two-way communication at the end of the day. Even in the natural realm, a dialogue is only complete when both parties have a chance to speak, listen and respond to each other. So, after talking to God, we also need to take time to listen to Him and know His will.

If we are truly His disciples, we need to make “listening” an active verb in our lives. John 10:27 says “My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me.”

How do you know God is speaking to us?

- **The confirmation of God’s word**  
It does not go against God’s commandment
- **The confirmation of Godly counsel**  
“...in the multitude of counsel, there is safety.” Proverbs 11:14
- **The confirmation of Circumstances**  
Seeing the needs around you
- **The confirmation of Peace (Inner Witness)**  
Sometimes God calms the sea, but sometimes God calms the sailor
- **The confirmation of Faith**  
God is in this despite the turmoil

**My insomnia friend**

"I overheard about this friend of mine who was absent for a long time due to depression. He was visiting the psychiatrist, but it didn't seem to work well. I felt God beckoned me to pray for this friend.

I told God, 'If it is Your will for me to pray for this friend, let me see him in class during recess, then I will do it.' Recess came and he was nowhere near. But the moment I went out of the classroom, I saw him at the library. I pulled him out and offered to pray for him.

One of his friends came out and saw me praying for him. His friend said to me, 'Why are you doing this? It will not work, if it does, it would have worked long ago.' I continued praying anyway, knowing that's what God had told me to do. After I finished praying, he left and God said that my job wasn't done.

I had to write a card for him. It had to state 'God loves you' along with a verse from Psalms. I asked the Holy Spirit, 'How is it possible?' There are 150 chapters in Psalms and He did not give me a verse or a chapter. While pondering on it, I went back to class and a friend of mine, Darryl who is a new believer saw me and asked me what happened. After I explained, he responded, 'Well, you believe it's from the Holy Spirit right? So if it's from the Holy Spirit, just do it.' I was shocked that a new believer could say such powerful words.

Darryl offered to look for a verse in the Bible, so I let him do it while I wrote the card. When he flipped the Bible, the first verse that came out was Psalm 4:8, 'I will both lie down in peace, and sleep; for You alone, O LORD, make me

dwell in safety.' I thought it was the right verse because my friend was also suffering from insomnia.

We put that verse down into a card, and I gave it to him after class. The next day, he was absent. The following day, I managed to see him and I asked, 'How was your sleep?' He said he slept so well that he missed school. He also asked me about Jesus and he went to church on his own. I was amazed by how God works. I simply looked to Him and just obeyed."
